Master of Arts in Voice Pedagogy

The program for the Master of Arts in Voice Pedagogy provides advanced studies for the performer and teacher-scholar. The program requires a minimum of 30 semester credit hours.

The program described below is not rigid. It is intended to indicate both the nature of the course work and the usual elements for fulfilling the requirements for the MA degree. The student's actual course work will be designed to provide a well-rounded total program, including depth in the major area and breadth in supportive studies.

The advisor, with the assistance of the MA Advisory Committee, has the right and the responsibility to determine the content of each assigned advisee's program. At least 50% of the courses must be designated graduate study only (courses at the 6000-8000 level).
